Work Experience

I graduated in Civil Engineering from The University Surrey having completed a "thick" sandwich course. I worked as an engineer on the M3 from Lightwater to Sunbury from the summer of 1971 to the winter of 1973/4 In 1974 I was a founder member and chief executive of a

specialist driven piling contractor (3M Foundations) to the heavy civil engineering sector. In 1990 the business was turning over £7.5m and had 120 employees by which time I had become an 80% shareholder. My original co-founder having retired and sold 30% of his shares to me and 10% to each of two of our then co-directors. The business was taken over by Balfour Beatty; I retained the Oxfordshire premises and leased

them to Balfour Beatty. I was consultant to the business for twelve months.

In 1992 I started doing some residential property development and in 1996 I took on a Partner to assume the "on site"role whilst I concentrated on all other aspects of the business. In addition to speculative residential development work we did selective contract work for known persons on a "cost plus open book" basis. My partner retired in 2013 and I continued to operate the business to closure in late 2015. Late 2015 to late 2019 I built some speculative industrial units independent from

the recently closed Partnership. Since "retirement" in 2019 I have been managing our retained



tenanted properties.

I am, and have been, the Model Register Captain (MRC) for the R230 since February 2020. Throughout my time as a member of the club I have been a regular supporter of club events, nationwide and overseas, and in this regard I was awarded, in 2019, the Footman James Spirit of the Club Trophy.

I have been a frequent contributor to the Gazette, a regular on the club Forum and since becoming MRC for the R230 I have produced eleven R230 newsletters.


Stuart Mathieson


